

Super 6 - Special questions for parents and carers to ask children before, during and after reading

Sometimes it's just wonderful to read a book together with no comments or questions – just enjoy the story...

Predicting questions	Look at the front cover — what is this going to be about? What do you think is going to happen on the next page? Why do you think so?
Connecting questions	Has this ever happened to you? To someone you know? How does X feel? Have you ever felt like that? What was your favourite part of the story? Why? Which is your favourite picture? Why?
